Hello and welcome to the Adelaide Eisteddfod Society's 2019 Vocal Division. My name is Ian Vayne and I am taking the role of Vocal Convenor for the Eisteddfod which was so wonderfully managed by Peter Hopkins. Peter's vision was to see youth who participate in the Eisteddfod have an enjoyable performance experience. It is my privilege to continue his vision and I am looking forward to hearing you, your children and students sing this year. I hope also to watch you all develop and progress over future years.

The origin of Eisteddfods is in 12th century Wales and the word means "to be sitting", in session. This event assembled bards who were poets, musicians and performers and the prizes were various objects made of silver. Over time the events waned as the bardic culture became less relevant to society. In 1846 there was a commission referred to as the "Blue Book", which included a scathing review of Welsh education. A desire to create a new national image rallied and from that a National Eisteddfod was envisioned and in 1858 The great Llangollen Eisteddfod occurred. With Welsh migration Eisteddfod culture has become a tradition in many countries including Australia.

We can be proud Adelaide embraces culture and continues the tradition of Eisteddfods. This year the Vocal Division continues to cater for singers in different age groups. Events range from "own choice", to very specific prizes such as Lieder and Wagner. The events will showcase different styles of music reflecting historical context, language and vocal demands.

The major competition in 2019 is "The Friends of the State Opera Dawn Wallace Award". I knew Dawn Wallace personally and found her to be a wonderful person and advocate for the arts in South Australia. It is a deserving tribute to Dawn to be associated with our wonderful young adults who will become our stars of the future.

Preparing for Performance

When performing it is assumed you have spent a lot of time in preparation of the piece. Make sure the piece is within your scope. Adjudicators are more impressed with musicality than virtuosity, especially if that virtuosity is flawed.

To audition is to ask, to perform is to give.

The Adelaide Eisteddfod is another opportunity to perform.

You have spent quite a bit of time preparing your piece.

You have worked through difficult sections and mastered them.

Remember now to enjoy yourself. This is an opportunity to perform your music with your family and the audience. Adjudicators love students who perform because they share their passion for music.

When you come on stage know that we are very happy you are there and will very much enjoy your performance.

Make a Real Event of It

- Dress up
- Present yourself well
- Good grooming, nice clothes, clean shoes
- This will create a good impression and boost your confidence

The Performance


Fill your head with the piece not the situation.

When emotion can no longer be expressed in words it is expressed in song.

The great joy of singing is being given the chance to express thoughts and words with much greater meaning than can be done just by talking.

As you move through the phrases think about what you are saying and sharing with the audience. If you are not thinking about the piece and how you wish to share it then you are not allowing yourself to perform. Get your thoughts back on the piece and perform it.

You have taken a lot of time and effort to prepare for the Eisteddfod. Now is the time to enjoy your opportunity to perform.



Our Future

As a part of our charter the Adelaide Eisteddfod Vocal Division will contribute to the preparation of our young artists.

We are seeking to run a series of ten Master Classes focused on training in performance and audition technique.





We wish to prepare our senior youth to be competitive on a national and international platform.

Our master teachers, conductors and special guests who will mentor this program.

The Adelaide Eisteddfod will partner with the Music Teachers' Association of South Australia.

The partnership will entitle teachers to attend, providing the young artists with an audience and the teachers can use the classes for their own personal development.

Financing this Activity

We expect most mentors will offer their services voluntarily. We are also fortunate in being offered a suitable venue at no cost. We will still need to pay for an accompanist and the occasional visiting artist.

To achieve our budget goal of \$2,500 we are planning a fund raising event called a "Rhapsody of Bohemians".

This will be a Sunday afternoon quiz-soiree-high tea event offering wonderful performances and fun facts.

It will feature our finest South Australian talent, showcasing a glimpse of the diverse repertoire of the Adelaide Eisteddfod ranging from folk song to Wagner.



We hope you will join us supporting our future South Australian stars and be thrilled by their performances. You may even hear a few unplanned performances from our special guests.






A Rhapsody of Bohemians



Adelaide Eisteddfod's Adjudicator 2019 Brian Gilbertson

Brian Gilbertson sold his legal practice in Adelaide in 1984 to study voice and drama in Vienna. After graduating from the Adelaide University with a Bachelor of Laws, Brian worked for 7 years as a lawyer in his own legal practise "Adams & Gilbertson." He then studied voice and drama at the Hochschule fuer Musik Darstellend Er Kunst in Vienna and privately with Maestro Franz Schuch - Tovini. He sang as a principal operatic tenor for 20 years at an international level with appearances in over 50 operas ranging from Wagner's Ring Cycle to works by Mozart, Britten, Stravinsky, Gilbert & Sullivan and Musicals. He innovated, directed and performed in new corporate shows combining rock and opera in the 1990's, produced and directed major outdoor events introducing sports/arts performances. He appeared at international sporting events introducing the first Australian performances of visiting nation's anthems' on Australia Day which is now part of all major Australia Day events. Brian has produced 6 commercial recordings. He later managed and directed what is recognised as the biggest Christmas Parade of its kind in the world, the Credit Union Christmas pageant. He has given several voice master classes at international venues and continued links with those students via his website tips. more recently on Facebook, reaching singers and teachers from over 180 countries. His goal is to continue to mentor young artists, both singers and actors. Brian has the capacity to produce, perform and direct festival events and to represent major arts organisations at Board level. His business and practical arts experience provide him with a unique skill set. Brian Gilbertson is a City of Adelaide Australia Day Citizen of the Year Award and an Adelaide Festival Centre Walk of Fame Star recipient.

- (c) an Aria in a different language from the two above.

All arias must be from the accepted performing repertoire of Opera.

Copies of selections must be provided for the adjudicator.

Competitors must provide their own accompanist and be sure he/she is available to perform at the required time.

This section is open to Australian Citizens only.



MBS YOUNG VIRTUOSO AWARD.

Singers from the Vocal Division who have been resident in South Australia for at least twelve months prior to, and aged 30 years or under on, December 31st 2019 may be selected for a chance to compete in the South Australian Final of "Young Virtuoso" to be hosted by 5MBS, Sunday October 13th 2.30pm, at St John's Church Halifax Street Adelaide. Young Virtuoso Admission (SA and National Finals): Adult \$20; 5MBS Members \$15; Student \$10

At the SA Final either an instrumentalist or vocalist will be selected to perform in the National Final. This year the National Final will be held at the same venue in Adelaide on Sunday November 24th. The winner will receive the Young Virtuoso Scholarship of \$10,000 provided by Freemasons Victoria and the Australian Fine Music Network of community radio stations. There will not be a specific section in which singers must perform. The adjudicator's decision will be based on all sections competitors have entered in the 2019 Vocal competitions. Competitors will need to demonstrate performance and vocal skills across a diverse range of singing styles. There is no additional entry fee.
